# Restoring a time of silence in the church:

Pope Francis says: "Mass is the highest form of prayer and not an appropriate moment for small talk." He continues, " at church, Catholics should spend their time in silence before Mass, preparing 'to meet with Jesus' instead of engaging in 'chitchat'. Silence is so important, remember, we are not going to a show. Silence prepares us and accompanies us". Vatican 15 Nov 2018.

# Plenary Council - Next Phase: Listening and Discerning:

The Plenary Council's six themes invite people to consider how God is calling the People of God to be a Christ-centred Church in Australia that is:

- 1. Missionary and Evangelising
- 3. Prayerful and Eucharistic

\$1035 for their worthy works.

- 5. A Joyful, Hope-Filled and Servant Community
- 2. Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal
- 4. Humble, Healing and Merciful
- 6. Open to Conversion, Renewal and Reform.

The broader Catholic community (that means US) is again called to take part in the next phase of the national process, a phase known as 'Listening and Discernment'.

Groups will now be formed in each parish/school – at least one each to focus on those six National Themes. The parish/school can have as many small groups (10-12 persons) as it likes, and this is encouraged. The small group gatherings will review the responses made during the Plenary Council's opening Listening and Dialogue stage, including people's questions and stories. The groups will also consider their relevant theme in light of Church teaching, tradition, Scripture and drawing from contemporary best practice within and outside the Church.

Each parish group will identify 2 or 3 emerging actions for each theme that can form a group submission to the Plenary Writing Group (PWG). The PWG will be composed of people — lay, religious, priests, and bishops — gifted with faith, knowledge, skills and attributes suited to the role.

The parish emerging actions will be submitted to the PWG in no more than 150 words and they need to be: clear; stated as positive; be as specific as possible, and, be a real action ie. practical, achievable and measurable.

Our parish will run at least one Theme every month until Easter 2020, when submissions close. The small group sessions are open to all, will take about two hours and involve some pre-meeting reading. To help prepare, go to <a href="https://plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au/resources/reports/">https://plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au/resources/reports/</a> and read the "snapshot reports". If you cannot access the site then contact the parish office for a copy. The group session structure is also at that site. A copy of the group meeting structure and all six "snapshot" reports is available in the Plenary Council Green Folder on the church back table. Please do not remove it from the church.

Our parish will call for group participants during early September.
